


# Marine Science Center Resident Saltwater Animal Guide



# Cownose Ray

*Rhinoptera bonasus*

- **Cownose Rays** are a species of eagle ray found throughout a large part of the western Atlantic and Caribbean, from New England, United States to southern Brazil. Cownose rays grow rapidly, and male rays often reach about 35 inches in width and weigh 26 pounds.




